

*** ELECTION SECURITY ***

★ VOTING MACHINES ★

- Tested before every election.
- Test results are double-checked by the county for additional oversight.
- Not connected to the internet; once tested, the machine cannot be "hacked."
- Tamper-proof security seals are placed on the machines and are confirmed by election workers on Election Day.
- Election workers confirm that each machine starts with zero votes on Election Day.

★ BALLOTS ★

- Every voter and ballot is tracked in a statewide database so that there is only one active ballot per registered voter.
- You can view your own voting history and track your ballot at MyVote.WI.gov
- Ballots cast by mail or in-person absentee voting are kept in a double-locked facility under 24-hour surveillance.
- By law, ballots are not opened and counted until after 7:00 a.m. on Election Day, which often means late-night results in larger elections.

★ ELECTION ADMINISTRATION ★

- Wisconsin has the most de-centralized election system in the U.S., with 1,852 municipal clerks, thousands of neighborhood election inspectors, and a bipartisan Wisconsin Election Commission.
- All aspects of In-Person Absentee Voting, Election Day voting, and counting of absentee ballots are open to citizen observers.
- Election responsibilities are split between state, county, and municipalities to ensure oversight and crosschecks.
