

HOW DO I VOTE BY ABSENTEE BALLOT

What is absentee voting? Absentee Voting is casting your vote before Election Day, either through the mail or at an In-Person Absentee Voting location.

Who can vote absentee? Any registered voter can vote absentee in Wisconsin – no reason is necessary.

Do I need a photo ID? Yes. Unless you are voting through the mail and certify that you are indefinitely confined or are a military or permanent overseas voter, you must present photo ID to vote absentee.

By Mail: Request to vote through the mail by going online to MyVote.WI.gov or call (414) 228-1700 to be mailed an application.

In-Person Absentee: Call (414) 228-1700 or visit Glendale-WI.gov/elections for dates, times and location to cast your in-person absentee ballot before the election.

Will My Ballot Be Counted? Yes. All absentee ballots are processed at the polling locations on Election Day. If your ballot is received by 8:00 p.m. on Election Day, it is processed and included with the final election results.

WHAT ARE THE QUALIFICATIONS TO REGISTER TO VOTE

- United States Citizen
- 18 years of age or older on Election Day
- A resident of Wisconsin and have lived at your current address for 28 days before the next election.
- Not currently serving a sentence, including probation, parole, or extended supervision, for a felony conviction.
 - Note: Misdemeanor convictions do not affect voting rights.
- Not otherwise disqualified from voting.

WHEN SHOULD I REGISTER OR UPDATE MY VOTER REGISTRATION?

You will need to register to vote or update your registration if you:

- Have not previously registered to vote in Wisconsin.
- Have had **any** change to your address since you last voted.
- Have had a name change since you last voted.
- Have not voted in over four years.

WHERE & WHEN CAN I REGISTER TO VOTE?

UNTIL 20 DAYS BEFORE EACH ELECTION:

- Online at MyVote.WI.gov.
- At Glendale City Hall.
- By mail (registration forms available at Glendale-WI.gov/elections).

UNTIL FRIDAY AT 5:00 P.M. BEFORE AN ELECTION:

- In-Person at City Hall.

ON ELECTION DAY:

- At your polling location (visit MyVote.WI.gov to find your polling location).

WHAT DOCUMENTS DO I NEED TO REGISTER TO VOTE?

ONLINE REGISTRATION:

If you have a Wisconsin Driver License or Wisconsin State Identification Card, no other documentation is necessary!

If the address on your license or ID is not current, you may update it on the Department of Motor Vehicle (DMV) website when completing the voter registration process.

You may register to vote online up to 20 days before each election.

ALL OTHER REGISTRATION METHODS:

If you are registering by mail or in-person (including Election Day), you are required to provide a **proof of residence document** that includes your **name** and **current address**.

Common proof of residence documents include:

- A WI Driver License or State ID.
- A cell phone or utility bill.
- A bank statement or paycheck.
- Any document (a letter, for example) issued to you by a government agency.

PHOTO ID FOR VOTING

Voters in Wisconsin must present acceptable photo identification. The address on the photo ID does not need to be current. Out of state licenses and identification cards are not allowed under state law.

The following photo IDs are the most commonly presented documents:

- A **Wisconsin Driver License**, even if driving privileges are revoked or suspended.
- A **Wisconsin Identification Card**, issued by the DMV (available for free).
- A **Military** or **Veteran ID**.
- A **U.S. Passport** book or card.

How Can I Get Involved?

The City of Glendale is hiring Election Inspectors to work at polling locations on Election Day.

Election Inspectors are paid \$15 per hour for working on Election Day, plus training.
